#### CONSULTANCY SERVICES FOR PROJECT TO STRENGTHEN THE CAPACITY OF KENYA TO CONTROL AND MANAGE CHEMICALS AND THE TRANSBOUNDARY MOVEMENT OF HAZARDOUS WASTES

##### Introduction

The Ministry of Environment and Mineral Resources and the UNEP Secretariat of the Basel Convention (SBC) intend to jointly undertake a project aimed at strengthening the capacity of Kenya to control and manage the transboundary movements of hazardous wastes in an environmentally sound manner as required by the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal, the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants, the Rotterdam Convention on the Prior Informed Consent Procedure for Certain Hazardous Chemicals and Pesticides in International Trade and the Strategic Approach to International Chemicals management (SAICM) as well as other relevant multilateral environmental agreements on chemicals and wastes.

The Project is to be implemented in three consecutive phases: **Phase 1:** Legal and institutional gaps and needs analysis; **Phase 2:** Strengthening of regulatory framework and legislative measures for Kenya; and **Phase 3:** Drafting an implementing legislation or regulatory measures for Kenya which will culminate in enhancement of implementation and enforcement capacity of Kenya through training, capacity-building, and development of a chemicals database. Three consultants will be required as follows:

- i. Consultant to prepare the needs and gaps analysis report for Kenya
- ii. Consultant for the development of legislative and regulatory measures, and
- iii. Consultant to develop a chemicals database (under SAICM Enabling Activities).

The Ministry of Environment and Mineral Resources now invites sealed proposals for the above Consultancies.
